

BLANDFORD CITES WORK OF STATION X

Co-operation of Citizens Must Finish Safety Job, Lions Told

John Blandford, safety director, told the Lion's Club Wednesday noon at the Metropole Hotel that Station X of the Police Department radiocast 52,500 messages from June 16 to Dec. 31 last year, an average of 270 a day and twice that number of telephone messages were handled.

"Firemen made 174,000 inspections in Cincinnati homes and buildings last year," he said. He also explained the street safety program worked out in co-operation with the Cincinnati Safety Committee, the Cincinnati Automobile Club, the Boy Scouts and other agencies.

"We can go just so far with efficient methods and good organization," Blandford said. "Results depend on the degree of citizen enthusiasm and participation. We can do much to reduce the carelessness, instability and nervousness that comes with city life."
