

# A Quick Look at Cincinnati City's Tallest Policeman Put Back on His Feet Downtown

Cincinnatians soon will get to look again at their tallest policeman—Patrolman Harry Koester, 6 feet, 9 inches, plus.

Mr. Koester, who has been "hidden away" for several years as a broadcaster at Station X, has been returned to foot duty with the Highway Safety Bureau, in new assignments announced Thursday. He may be stationed at his old posts in the downtown area.

Patrolman Walter Hays, who has been on swing shift duty, will succeed Mr. Koester at Station X. Patrolman John Arthur of District 7, will take Mr. Hays' old post.

In other detail changes, Patrolman William Dankert was transferred from the Highway Safety Bureau to District 6. Patrolman Edwin J. Noll, of District 2, was listed as resigned, to enter the service station business.

The check will finance extensive research into chemicals which might prevent polio or halt the paralyzing effects. The work will be done at the Children's Hospital Research Foundation by a technical crew headed by Dr. Albert B. Sabin, professor of research pediatrics at the U. C. College of Medicine and internationally-known expert in polio problems.
