

Environmental injustice is about people in Detroit, Ohio, Chicago, Memphis, Kansas City, and so many other locations who have died and others who are chronically ill because of exposure to toxins

Climate change and environmental injustice: we work to address the many practices that are harming communities nationwide and worldwide


Because everyone deserves a Fair Shake.
